Cool running on the Terrible Two • Colwell gets it right this time

With midweek temperatures near 100° in Cloverdale prior to this year's Terrible Two double century, participants were dreading one of the event's infamous Skaggs Springs blast furnaces, and organizers were wondering if they had enough sags lined up to haul away the bodies. In the end, all the worries were washed away in a cool blanket of fog that shrouded the course until nearly noon, keeping conditions to a level that might be described as almost ideal for a long, tough ride. The sun didn't put in an appearance until near the summit of the Geysers (around mile 80). It then stayed sunny until late afternoon around Fort Ross (mile 160). After that, the setting sun played hide-and-seek behind wispy clouds and forested ridgelines until, in the evening, it became downright chilly. Only on the more exposed stretches of Skaggs did the midday heat build up to anything remotely toasty...probably in the mid-80's but feeling—to the struggling riders—more like mid-90's.

There were 227 registered riders and 195 actual starters. Of these, 169 finished, 157 by the 10:00 PM cut-off, thereby earning themselves the coveted, free "I Did It!" t-shirts. That's a higher-than-average finishing rate for this brutal ride, and is probably due in equal parts to the relatively mellow weather and the great support (by a crew that numbered over 75...or one volunteer for every three riders).

This year's top finisher was Tracy Colwell, a noted hill-meister and Cat 2 racer from the South Bay. This was sweet redemption for Colwell. Last year, while riding near the front in his first TT, he was led astray by a vandalized course marking. When he should have turn left on Fort Ross Road, he went straight on Meyers Grade...all the way down the long, steep hill. Only when he got to the junction with Hwy 1 did he realize his mistake, at which point he turned around and climbed back up the hill...a round trip of ten miles, with the return climb varying between 10% and 18% (after 168 miles and 15,000' of climb). This knocked him out of any contention for the overall or even the top ten, but he was cheerfully upbeat about it afterward. This year, somewhat wiser to the ways of the TT, he rode a more calculated, more aggressive ride. He was first up Trinity, first up the Geysers, first over Skaggs, and first everywhere else, finishing in 11:30, just ten minutes off the course record, and six minutes clear of Ray Plumhoff (second last year as well).

Berkeley's Tanya Wolff was the top women's finisher, with a time of 13:32. That's the second fastest women's time ever. Only two out of the four entered tandems finished, with Tom and Cindy Long matching their previous best time (from 1995) of 13:43...still the third best time ever for a co-ed tandem. There were two recumbents entered and Zach Kaplan and Bruce deBell finished together in 14:38...second best 'bent time ever.

One final record: John Abbe of Sacramento finished in 16:12. Not too great a time, you say? Perhaps you'd be more impressed if you knew John turned 71 the week of the Terrible Two, becoming the only over-70 rider to complete the event. John figures this might be his last TT, so he took a camera along and snapped pictures all day...a ride for the memories.

Perhaps the saddest hard-luck story of this year's TT belongs to the tandem team of Rich Boettner and Chuck Doyle. They had been having a great season, tearing up doubles courses all over the state, and they were ranked third overall in the prestigious California Triple Crown Stage Race (after two events, with just the TT to go to lock up that podium finish). Unfortunately, on the most remote part of the course—miles from any help—they stripped out their rear hub. Sag wagons offered to haul them in, but they refused to quit. Instead, they sent the sags off in search of a wheel that would fit their bike...a long, complicated search that had folks driving all over Sonoma County. Meanwhile, the two riders continued as best they could: walking for miles on the flats and uphills and coasting on the descents. It's unclear how many miles they covered in this way—somewhere between 25 and 50—but finally, after dark, they simply ran out of time and had to abandon, just a few miles from the finish.

Our annual True Grit-No Brains Award goes to SRCC member John Eberly. Last year John got honorable mention in this category for riding 175 miles with a shoulder that had been disloacated a few days before the TT. He had to pack it in at that point because of the pain. This year, John missed a nasty turn on the descent off the backside of the Geysers at about mile 85. Witnesses said he and his bike bounced and tumbled all the way down a 60-foot rock cliff that they described as "nearly vertical." John said, "I just kept wondering when I would stop falling." Rescuers climbed down and were able to bring John and his bike up via a longer, less steep traverse. Amazingly, although the bike was dinged in many ways, it was still ridable (barely), and while John was covered in scrapes and bruises from one end to the other, he sustained no major injuries. So, after a few mechanical and medical tweaks, he got back on the bike and continued...and finished with a fairly respectable time!

That never-say-die determination—of Rich and Chuck and John—is the same fierce fire that burns in the heart of every rider who attempts such a challenging feat. We're proud to be associated with such a group of people. We offer a tip of our battered old helmets to the class of 1998, Terrible Two U...graduates of the school of hard knocks.
